ITEM 1 Opening of the ISSF 2024 GA and welcome of the Delegates by the President

President Luciano Rossi welcomed all the delegates to the 2024 ISSF General Assembly in Rome, Italy and thanked the Member Federations for their participation. He declared the 2024 ISSF General Assembly as open. The President the President gave the floor to Mr. Giovanni Malago, the President of the Italian National Olympic Committee (CONI) who is hosting today's General Assembly.

Mr. Malago greeted everyone and stated that there is a long history behind the CONI headquarters. He noted that Italy has hosted a lot of prestigious international sports events, such as the FIFA World Cup and the Olympic Games among others and that the shooting sport family should strive to attract more media attention and sponsors. Mr. Malago stated that he is a member of the IOC Coordination Commission LA28 and that he is in full support of the shooting sport and ISSF. He informed that he is also a member of the Olympic Programme Commission where discussions on inclusion of certain sports are being held, such as cricket or American football. Mr. Malago reported about the ongoing discussions regarding inclusion of new sports disciplines into the Olympic Games and emphasized that the traditional sports disciplines must stay close. He highlighted that he is very optimistic about the future of ISSF. Mr. Malago noted that he is the President of the Organizing Committee of Milano Cortina 2026 and informed about the reasons for choosing Milano and Cortina to host the Winter Olympic Games. Lastly, he thanked everyone for attending and wished the ISSF and all delegates a great General Assembly and good luck.

Mr. Alessandro Nicotra di San Giacomo, the ISSF Secretary General, informed that three friends of ISSF have recorded a greeting video to be demonstrated at the General Assembly.

The pre-recorded greeting video by Mr. Thomas Bach, the President of the IOC, was displayed.

The pre-recorded greeting video by Mr. Niccolo Campriani, the Sports Director of Olympic and Paralympic Games LA 2028, was displayed.

ITEM 2 Roll-call of voting powers and establishment of voting list and quorum

The President passed the floor to the Secretary General to chair the General Assembly. The Secretary General informed that 127 out of 153 ISSF Member Federations with voting rights take part in today's General Assembly and that there are a total of 231 votes. He noted that the quorum of 1/3 of the Member Federations for taking decisions according to Article 6.13 of the ISSF Constitution as well as the quorum of 1/2 of the Member Federations for making amendments to the ISSF Constitution in accordance with Article 26.2 of the ISSF Constitution are reached.

ITEM 3 Approval of the summoning and of the Agenda

The Secretary General asked the delegates if there are any objections to the summoning and the agenda of today's General Assembly. No objections were made.

Decision: The summoning and the agenda of the 2024 ISSF General Assembly were unanimously approved.

ITEM 4a Election of the Minutes Committee on proposal of the Executive Committee

The Secretary General reported that the ISSF Executive Committee proposed that Ms. Biserka Vrbek (Chairperson of the ISSF Statutes and Eligibility Committee), Mr. Alessandro Nicotra di San Giacomo (Secretary General) and Mr. Peter Underhill be appointed as the members of the Minutes Committee for this 2024 ISSF General Assembly.

Decision: The proposal for the Minutes Committee was unanimously approved.

ITEM 4b Election of the Scrutinizers

The Secretary General reported that five people representing each continent are proposed to be appointed as the Scrutinizers, namely Mr. Stefan Rrufa from Europe, Mr. Adam Sachs from Oceania, Mr. Cassio Rippel from Americas, Mr. Shirantha Peiris from Asia and Ms. Annie Mungoma from Africa.

Decision: The proposal for the election of the Scrutinizers was unanimously approved.

ITEM 5a Report of the President

A video was displayed regarding the achievements and works of the President and the ISSF management since 2022 ISSF General Assembly.

The President welcomed all Delegates and presented his report about his as well as the ISSF administration's activities and achievements in the past years since the last General Assembly was held. The President reported about the activities to attract young generation to the shooting sport, to increase media attention as well as sponsorship opportunities for the ISSF. He discussed about the growth of esports and how the shooting sport is getting to be popular in the esports world. The President informed about the ongoing discussions to include para shooting under the umbrella of ISSF and the actions taken for sustainability purposes. He emphasized that the athletes are always at the heart of the ISSF plans and activities and highlighted that the reintroduction of the ISSF World Cup Final gave the athletes another opportunity to compete and demonstrate great performance. The President highlighted the ISSF's communications plan which is crucial for ISSF's reputation.

The General Assembly gave applause, and no questions were raised.

The President informed that Ms. Danka Hrbekova (Bartekova), the IOC Member is also attending today's General Assembly. The General Assembly gave applause.

ITEM 5b Report of the Secretary General

The Secretary General presented his report about his and his team's activities since his appointment in February 2024. The Secretary General reported that the 2024 Olympic Games was a great success for shooting sport, especially in terms of visibility. He emphasized the works that are being carried out for TV production and media coverage of the shooting competitions.

The Secretary General informed about the newly updated ISSF website and increased social media presence of ISSF overall. He reported about the virtual reality games and their crucial role in attracting more and more people to the shooting sport. In addition, the Secretary General stated that in collaboration with SIUS an application is planned to be developed for the athletes via which they can keep track of their performances at different competitions in detail. He then presented the members of the ISSF management team and thanked all of them. The Secretary General also addressed the importance of attracting young generations to the shooting sport and informed about the great success of the ISSF House during the Olympic Games in Paris. He indicated that the ISSF Member Federations will have the opportunity to acquire media rights for different competitions directly from ISSF at a reasonable price in the future.

A video about the ISSF House was also displayed.

The General Assembly gave applause, and no questions were raised.

ITEM 5c Report of the Auditors

The Secretary General reported that there were some problems with passing over of data and information from previous financial consultants to the present ones, meaning that the report for 2023 is not available to be presented in today's General Assembly but the 2022 Auditors' Report is available, as indicated in the agenda.

Mr. Massimo Baiamonte, the financial advisor of the ISSF, firstly stated that the preparation of the balance is being delayed but that the balance of 2022 was finalized on 30 November 2023 meaning that there is only a delay for circulating the documents. He pointed out that the auditor could not attend today's General Assembly, therefore he will explain the report instead. Mr. Baiamonte informed that the auditor is Kleeberg & Partner and presented the auditor's conclusion for the year 2022. He informed that a similar positive conclusion has been reached by the auditor for the year 2023. Mr. Baiamonte noted that the documents for 2023 might have been already sent to the Member Federation, but once again noted that due to the delay in receiving the documents from the previous consultants as well as the deadline to circulate the General Assembly agenda, the report for 2023 cannot be discussed right now.

Mr. György Nagy stated that he did not receive any additional documents regarding 2023 balances.

Mr. Baiamonte noted that he assumed that the ISSF Office would have sent it and asked if anyone received it.

Mr. Nagy asked to resend the financial documents for 2023 which includes the balance sheets.

Secretary General pointed out that the ISSF received the financial documents for 2023 from the Auditors shortly before the General Assembly and forward to the Member Federation. He reported that the Auditors' Report for 2023 has not been published on the ISSF website but will be available soon. The Secretary General thanked Mr. Baiamonte.

The General Assembly gave applause, and no further questions were raised.

ITEM 6 Approval of the Auditors' Reports (including final balances)

The Secretary General asked the General Assembly to approve the Auditors' Report for 2022.

Decision: The General Assembly unanimously approved the Auditors' Report for 2022.

ITEM 7 Discharge of Responsibility of the Executive Committee and Secretary General

The Secretary General asked the General Assembly to discharge the Executive Committee for the year 2022.

Decision: The General Assembly unanimously discharged the Executive Committee for the year 2022.

The Secretary General highlighted that the discharge of the Secretary General refers to the calendar year 2022, in which Mr. Alexander Ratner was the Secretary General of the ISSF.

The Secretary General asked the General Assembly to discharge Mr. Alexander Ratner as the ISSF Secretary General for the year 2022.

Decision: The General Assembly unanimously discharged Mr. Ratner for the year 2022

ITEM 8 Amendments to ISSF Constitution

The Secretary General gave the floor to Ms. Biserka Vrbek, the Chairperson of the Statutes and Eligibility Committee to give a presentation on the proposed amendments to the ISSF Constitution. She reported that the proposed amendments to the ISSF Constitution include some changes for good governance purposes as well as for inclusion of esports into the shooting sport in addition to some editorial amendments. She gave a brief presentation of the proposed changes and noted that the proposals for amendments to the ISSF Constitution were sent to the ISSF Member Federations beforehand for any comments and that no feedback or questions were received. She informed that none of the amendments relate to the rights and obligations of the ISSF Member Federations.

The President announced to the Delegates that one proposal for amendment of the ISSF Constitution, namely the proposal to amend Article 4.6.4 of the ISSF Constitution is withdrawn as a proposal to vote on by the General Assembly. The Secretary General asked the Delegates if they agree that the proposal to amend Article 4.6.4 of the ISSF Constitution is removed from the voting. No objections were raised by the Delegates.

Decision: the proposal to amend Article 4.6.4 of the ISSF Constitution is removed from the voting in this General Assembly.

The Secretary General submitted to the Delegates the proposal to vote whether they agree to conduct the voting on the constitutional amendments via electronic secret ballot. For this, the Delegates were asked to show their votes by using the paper voting cards. The General Assembly decided with simple majority to use the electronic voting system for the vote on the constitutional amendments.

Decision: Voting on the constitutional amendments shall be held via electronic secret ballot.

In the following, the Scrutinizers and the ISSF staff members handed out the electronic voting devices to the Member Federation Delegates one-by-one. Delegates from 127 Member Federations with a total of 231 votes were given the corresponding electronic voting devices. Hence, the roll call for the voting on the constitutional amendments has been confirmed.

Mr. Nagy stated that he has to bring up the matter of financial report again as he just received the balance sheet. He noted that assets, equities and liabilities had to be the same figure from 2023, which are not, and therefore, he believes there is a mistake in the balance sheet.

The Secretary General indicated that the balance sheet is for information only and has not been approved yet. The Secretary General asked Mr. Baiamonte to take point raised into account.

The service provider for the electronic voting system explained how the electronic voting devices are to be used.

Mr. Christian Keidel, the legal advisor to the ISSF, clarified again that it has been agreed that the proposed amendment to Article 4.6.4 of the ISSF Constitution was removed from the voting.

One test voting was conducted.

Mr. Keidel reported that any amendments to the ISSF Constitution require 2/3 majority of the valid votes cast in accordance with the ISSF Constitution and that the abstentions are not considered as valid votes cast. He noted that proposed amendments to some articles which concern merely editorial, language or style changes will be voted as a group.

ITEM 9 Report of the ISSF Marketing Unit

Mr. Andrea Cuneo, Head of the ISSF Marketing Unit, presented and thanked the ISSF Marketing team and presented the report of the ISSF Marketing Unit. In summary, Mr. Cuneo reported about the integration of virtual reality into the shooting sport. He informed that ISSF was present in Milan Games Week where 647 shooting matches were played over one weekend. Mr. Cuneo also reported about the collaboration negotiations between the ISSF and Fortnite as well as the candidacy of the ISSF for the 2025 Olympic Esports Games. Furthermore, he informed about the AI system which will be implemented into the ISSF website to answer questions regarding ISSF Rules and Regulations.

The General Assembly gave applause, and no questions were raised.

ITEM 10 Report of the ISSF Communications Unit

Mr. Nicolas Davies, Head of the ISSF Communications Unit, presented and thanked the Communications team and presented the report of the ISSF Communications Unit. In summary, Mr. Davies reiterated the President's statement that the athletes lie at the heart of the ISSF activities and talked about the newly updated ISSF website. He informed about the media workshop organized in Paris and another one to be organized next week and emphasized the importance of attracting young people to the sport. Mr. Davies reported that the number of followers of social media accounts of ISSF have increased drastically and pointed out that during the Paris Olympic Games the ISSF has attracted significant media attention, in particular, due to two athletes who received outstanding media attraction. He remarked that those media stories were initiated and enhanced by the ISSF Office and its team of communication professionals. He noted that a lot of interviews were held at the ISSF House during the Olympic Games and informed that 10 goals which were put to the Communication team in the beginning of 2024 were all achieved successfully. Mr. Davies also indicated that the shooting sport is being part of the esports community and that various connections with people from the IOC as well as media help drawing the attention to this inclusive sport. He emphasized that media trainings are also planned to take place in 2025 in addition to updating the ISSF website.

The General Assembly gave applause, and no questions were raised.

ITEM 11 Report of the ISSF Academy

The Secretary General moved to the next point, the report of the ISSF Academy. He highlighted that it is a matter of high personal importance for him to unambiguously underline that the ISSF Academy is doing a fantastic job and is working highly professional. He remarked that he cannot understand any rumor that indicates otherwise, and he pointed out that such rumors are only spread with the intent to divide the shooting family. The Secretary General urged everyone to just message to and inquire with the ISSF management in case of any complaints or concerns.

Mr. Vesa Nissinen, the ISSF Academy Director, presented the report of the ISSF Academy. In summary, Mr. Nissinen gave a brief information about himself and then indicated that the ISSF Academy has achieved a lot since its creation which took place eight months ago. He informed about the team members of the ISSF Academy management and reported about the courses offered by the ISSF Academy. Mr. Nissinen indicated that the IOC was also interested in the

ISSF Academy and then presented a brief overview of the works done in every month since March 2024.

The Secretary General addressed the potential question regarding the meaning of the Merit Based License and explained the reasoning behind the Merit Based License as well as the process through which it can be obtained. He emphasized that in the future only professional coaches will be allowed to be present in the field of play, meaning that the family and friends will no longer be allowed to enter the field of play.

Mr. Nissinen encouraged the ISSF Member Federations to support the coaches who apply for the licenses at the ISSF Academy. He also reiterated the close collaboration with the Continental Confederations, in particular the Asian Shooting Confederation.

H.E. Sheikh Salman Al Sabah reported that a coaching course is currently being held in Central Asia and thanked the ISSF and the ISSF Academy on behalf of the Asian Shooting Confederation for the excellent work and highly professional coaching education that is offered by the ISSF Academy, by Mr. Nissinen and his team.

Mr. Peries inquired with Mr. Nissinen whether the part of the ISSF Academy courses where the physical presence is required could be organized in other regions as well so that it is closer to the people who are taking the courses.

Mr. Nissinen replied that the ISSF Academy is always trying to support the ISSF Member Federations. In particular, he noted that the ISSF Academy is inquiring about the Olympic Solidarity Programme through which the Member Federations could be financially supported in order to conduct their own coaching courses. He noted that in any case the present platform will serve as a basis and that currently, the ISSF Academy is a little overloaded and short of staff.

The General Assembly gave applause, and no further questions were raised.

ITEM 12 Miscellaneous

The Secretary General informed that Mr. Christian Holtz, the Managing Director of World Para Sports at International Paralympic Committee, was supposed to give a presentation on the matter of the ongoing discussion with the IPC of including para shooting into the ISSF family, but that he could not attend the General Assembly today as he got sick. Therefore, the Secretary General suggested holding an online convention for the ISSF Member Federations later regarding this matter.

ITEM 13 Closing of the ISSF 2024 GA by the President

The President thanked everyone and closed the General Assembly.
